## **PAYMENT OF DEARNESS RELIEF UNDER REGULATION -37**

As you are aware that one of the issues discussed in conference held on 10<sup>th</sup> November 2019 was "Filing of Court case for Payment of Dearness Relief under Pension Regulation -37". Shri C.N.Parshad, General Secretary State Bank Retirees Organisation was the Chief Guest who presented his key note address on this occasion. He presented his views especially on Pension Issues like D. A.neuterilisation, updation of pension, welfare activities for retirees. **He urged upon the members to give their consent to become petitioners in the legal case for payment of D.A, as per Pension Regulation 37 and arrange to deposit/give debit authority for Rs.5000/- to be paid to SBPROA so that a legal case may be filed in Hon'ble court. Detailed circular No. 36 of 2017-20 dated 12th September 2019 was sent to members wherein SBRA informed about and forwarded the orders of Hon'ble Supreme Court in our Contempt Petition. Even though we had not thought about claiming payment of Dearness Relief in terms of Regulation 37, as on the date of retirement, when we filed the Writ Petition, we tried to include this benefit in contempt Petition. However, Hon'ble Judge had decided not to consider our request and we are successful in including this issue in the orders. Only State Bank of Mysore VRS retirees who were petitioners got arrears with interest at 9%. Therefore, there is incentive for joining the legal struggle.** 

But, this has given us a lot of advantages. Now, delay and latches are not applicable, even though we are filing Writ Petition now and we can secure higher rate of interest by bring various aspects to the notice of the Court. We can also fight for extending this benefit to entire erstwhile Associate Bank pensioner community.

## Now we have received further details which are given as under:

Essence of large number Judgments of Hon'ble Supreme Court including five judge benches is that 'Retrospective amendment of statutory rules adversely affecting pension of employees who have already retired on the date of notification is invalid'. Bank Employees' Pension Regulations, 1995 are statutory in nature and therefore this principle in respect of retrospective amendments cannot take away vested rights. It is also decided by Hon'ble Supreme Court that Joint Note/Settlement cannot be in derogation of statutory Pension Regulations. However, State Bank of Mysore Employees' Pension Regulations, 1995 have not been amended, not even once, from the date of notification of these Pension Regulations on the 23rd March,1996. In fact, Division Bench of Karnataka High Court, in its order dated 08.03.2012 has ordered State Bank of Mysore to pay cost of Rs.10,000/- to each of the petitioner/pensioners, for continuing litigation, without merit despite not amending pension regulations.

But, the Bank maintains that those who have retired under VRS – 2001 have not retired under Pension Regulations, but in terms of a Contractual Scheme. But, this Contractual Scheme, VRS – 2001 has listed benefits which are available to these retirees include payment of pension in terms of Pension Regulations, as on the date of their retirement. The Bank has also stated before Hon'ble Supreme Court, in Contempt Petition that the Dearness Relief for Pensioners is being paid in terms of Bipartite Settlement. Our Commune, through State Bank Retirees' Association, with the aid and assistance of several decisions of Hon'ble Supreme, is confident of securing this benefit of increased Dearness Relief in terms of Pension Regulations to its members. Table with details of benefit to our members under various Bipartite Settlement period demonstrate the magnitude of the benefits. Contd......2...

Arrears of Pension provided above are without interest and pensioners are entitled to interest also. The quantum of interest on the arrears may even be more than the arrears amount, which depends on applicable rate of interest based on orders of the Courts. State Bank Retirees' Association has made sufficient amount of studies. State Bank Retirees' Association is also equipped with persons with adequate knowledge & experience. Members of our Affiliate, SBM Pensioners' Commune have won the case after a very long struggle of over 17 years.

With their support, State Bank Retirees' Association would strive for payment of arrears and including substantial increase in pension and payment of consequential arrears. Team - Commune has the wherewithal to deliver these benefits. Over 650 of its members are beneficiaries in the legal journey undertaken regarding 1616-1684 and/or 5 years notional service issues.

Experience shows that the State Bank of India pays benefits ordered by even Hon'ble Supreme Court only to Petitioners. Non-payment of interest to non-petitioners in five years issue of VRS - 2001 and nonpayment of this benefit to similarly placed retirees of other Banks are the examples of such practice. Those who thought that the benefits ordered by Courts would automatically extended to all have understood hard way. Even Hon'ble Supreme Court has ordered benefit of payment of Gratuity calculated on last pay drawn in respect of Officers who retired during 1993 - 1994 only to the Petitioners. Many similarly placed retirees have been deprived of the benefit, because they are not the petitioners. Therefore, members should participate in all struggles. To participate in such struggles, members should have full information as to the benefits. To provide full information and to clear apprehensions and doubts, please attend meetings organised in this regard. SBRA HAS DECIDED AS UNDER

- . To file Writ Petition in respect of 6<sup>th</sup>, 7th, 8th, 9th and 10th BPS retirees regarding payment of Dearness Relief as per Regulations :
- To collect Rs.5,000/- now and Debit Authorization for a sum equivalent to two months' arrears in respect of 10th Bipartite retirees :
- To collect Rs.5,000/- now and Debit authorization for a sum equivalent to 5% of arrears receivable as on date in respect of 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> 8th and 9th Bipartite Settlement ;
- Provide the list of beneficiaries to the Court.
